The Original Songs of Christmas: A Song of Hope

The Existential Reality of Hope (Luke 2:21-26)

"And at the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb" (Luke 2:21).

"Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins" (Isaiah 40:1-2).

The Hope of Jesus Is The Light (Luke 2:27-32).

"[Simeon] took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said, 'Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eye have seen Your salvation'" (Luke 2:28-29).

"I am the Lord; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people a light for the nations" (Isaiah 42:6).

God's Hope through Jesus Overcomes Rejection (Luke 2:33-35).

"And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary His mother, 'Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed" (Luke 2:34).

"And He will become a sanctuary and a stone of offense and a rock of stumbling to both houses of Israel, a trap and a share to the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Isaiah 8:14).
