John 13:31-35

The Way of the Savior: The Way Of Love

Jesus turns humiliation to glorification (John 13:31-33).

“When [Judas] had gone out, Jesus said, ‘Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him’” (John 13:31).

“The cross most perfectly made known the heart of Jesus; and for Jesus, to be known was to be glorified. The love of Jesus was about to be revealed in a new way. ‘If His death is His glorifying, it must be because in that death something is done which was not completed by the life, however fair; by the words, however wise and tender; by the works of power, however restorative and healing’”
(Alexander Maclaren).

Jesus’ glorification grants us a higher calling (John 13:34-35).

“A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another” (John 13:34, 35).

“We are to love our neighbor as ourselves, but we are to love our fellow-Christians as, Christ loved us, and that is far more than we love ourselves”
(Charles Spurgeon).

“So Tertullian reports the pagans of his day (a century after this Gospel was published) as saying of Christians, ‘See how they love one another!’”
(F. F. Bruce, *The Gospel of John*).
