Clearing Away the Clutter

“And Peter said to them, ‘Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Nature of the Church and the Continuity of the Covenant of Grace
