The God Questions: Is God Real?

Stating the Obvious or the Oblivious

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge" (Psalm 19:1-2).

Doubt is natural and potentially wonderful
