Hebrews 12:25-29
The Gift of Gratitude: Grateful for Receiving

The Gift of Gratitude is built from the Kingdom Up! (1-25)

Gratitude for what we have received (vv. 1-2)

“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses...” (v. 1).

Gratitude for the example of Jesus (vv. 3-4)

“Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted” (v. 3).

Gratitude for the strength of discipline (vv. 5-17)

“It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline?” (v. 7).


Gratitude for a faith that is bold (vv. 18-24)

“For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest...” (v. 18).

With so much to be grateful for, watch out for the destructive power of ingratitude (25-29)

“See that you do not refuse him who is speaking” (v. 25).

“Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire” (vv. 28-29).
