Now What? The Gospel Crosses Boundaries
Acts 9-10

Grace Takes the Initiative (Acts 9:1–43)

“But the Lord said to [Ananias], ‘Go, for [Saul] is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel. For I will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name’” (Acts 9:15-16).

Grace Includes the Nations (Acts 10:1-33)

“And there came a voice to [Peter]: ‘Rise, Peter; kill and eat.’ But Peter said, ‘By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean.’ And the voice came to him again a second time, ‘What God has made clean, do not call common.’ This happened three times, and the thing was taken up at once to heaven” (Acts 10:13-16).

“And [Peter] said to them, ‘You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a Jew to associate with or to visit anyone of another nation, but God has shown me that I should not call any person common or unclean’” (Acts 10:28).

The Spirit Calls One Family In Christ (Acts 10:34-48)

“So Peter opened his mouth and said: ‘Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears Him and does what is right is acceptable to Him’ ... While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word...because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles” (Acts 10:34, 44-45).
